FamilyFirst Alerts is a new emergency notification response system for schools K-12. It represents a significant breakthrough in terms of cost-efficiency (less than four dollars/student/year), and its ability to notify parents, emergency services, civic authorities, media, and others, instantly and reliably. This is accomplished through the use of text messaging (SMS or Short Message Service), which can be automatically programmed or manually sent out by school administrators.

This service is unique in its ability to reach one or thousands of cell phone numbers instantly and reliably, anywhere that individual person is with his/her cell phone. If there is no cell phone response, messages can be sequentially sent out to a pager or email.
